This album was produced in a haze of extreme paranoia following the terrorist attacks on New York City two years ago. *Emulatory Whoredom* is the latest installment of Wally's unique flavor of downtempo beatz that built a following in the headz scene in the US and Europe during the late '90s.

DJ Wally (aka Pish Posh when he writes drum'n'bass) was born Keef Destefano in 1972 in Queens New York City. He has lived there ever since, becoming one of the leading lights in the downtempo abstract beatz scene that rose from the New York dance underground in the mid-90's. Combining hip-hop sensibilities with drum'n'bass leanings and a strong taste for the absurdly silly and abstractly surreal, Wally has been carving his own niche on the worldwide beatheadz stage now for over 8 years as well as spinning wax for over 16 years. Wally's musical heritage dates back to an early love of hip-hop, electro, and electronic music pioneers such as Kraftwerk and Art of Noise. A sample spotter from a very young age, Wally's favorite pastime as a kid was recording early hip-hop radio shows and dissecting the songs. In addition to his 5 full lenghts as DJ Wally, he has made 2 mix CD's as Pish Posh, and released countless tracks on compilations and 12"'s.

Tracks from this album will be available on vinyl (as two separate 12" EP's) from the Agriculture in August.
